### Prof. Dr. (Med). Otchere Addai-Mensah Keynote Speaker



Prof. Dr. (Med). Otchere Addai-Mensah is an Associate Professor of Haematology and Immunology at the Department of Medical Diagnostics, Faculty of Allied Health Sciences in the College of Health Sciences at the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Techmology and presently the Chief Executive Officer of the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital in Kumasi. He served as the

Deputy Director, Student Affairs, Vice Dean of Students and President of the University Teachers' Association of Ghana- KNUST.

He is a trained medical doctor and holds a BSc in Human Biology and an MBChB from the School of Medical Sciences of the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST), an MSc. in Biomedical Sciences (Haematology) from the University of Westminster in London-UK, and a PhD. in Immunology and Biotechnology from the prestigious RWTH University in Aachen, Germany.

He previously worked as a Researcher in the Pharmaceutical Product Development Department at the Fraunhofer Institute for Molecular Biology and Applied Ecology in Germany, and as a Resident in the Department of Internal Medicine at the Komfo Anokye Teaching Hospital in Kumasi. He has served previously as a member of the Governing Council of the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, and the Governing Board of the Nursing and Midwifery Council, Ghana. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Leadership and Governance, and a member of both the British Society of Immunology and the Ghana Medical Association.

### Prof. Sebastian Eliason CHAIRMAN



Prof. Sebastian Eliason is a Professor of Population, Family, Reproductive and Child Health and the Dean of the School of Medical Sciences, University of Cape Coast. He is a Fellow of West Africa College of Physicians (Community Health) and the Royal Society for Public Health. He also holds a PhD in Population and Health and is a Medical Technology Engineer. University of

Ghana Medical School, School of Public Health-University of Ghana, University of Cape Coast and St Bartholomew & Dentistry. His work experience spans a period of twenty-seven years, with an appreciable knowledge of the functioning of Ghana's health system.

As an International Consultant, he has supported all 54 African countries through the African Union and the United Nations Population Fund to review and develop policies and strategies to improve Maternal, Neonatal Child and Adolescent Health in Africa including the current African Union Commission's Plan of Action 2016-2030 (Maputo Plan of Action), that provides the framework to achieve universal access to Reproductive Health and Rights in Africa, and guidelines for Obstetric Fistula, Emergency Obstetric and Neonatal Care (EMoNC), Family Planning and Reproductive Health Commodity Security. Prof. Sebastian Eliason has served on several local and International Boards and Committees and has several publications to his credit (including peer reviewed journal articles, technical reports, and abstracts).

### **Professor Richard MK Adanu**RECTOR- GHANA COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS



Professor Richard MK Adanu is the Rector of Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons since February 2021. He is a Specialist Obstetrician Gynaecologist and Women's Reproductive Health Epidemiologist.

He is a graduate of the University of Ghana Medical School Accra, Ghana. He has a Master of Public Health (MPH) degree from the Johns Hop-

kins Bloomberg School of Public Health as a Gates scholar and was admitted into the Delta Omega Public Health Honor Society. He is a Fellow of Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons and the West African College of Surgeons and an honorary Fellow of American College of Obstericians and Gynecologists.

Professor Adanu served as the Dean of the University of Ghana School of Public Health from August 2012 to July 2018. He served as the Editor in Chief of the International Journal of Gynecology and Obstetrics from 2014 to 2020. His research is in both the clinical and social aspects of women's health. His research interests are epidemiology of obstetric and gynaecological disorders in Ghana, family planning, cervical cancer screening and maternal injuries.

Professor Adanu is widely published in the fields of Obstetrics and Gynaecology and Women's Health with over 120 peer reviewed publications, several Editorial publications as well chapters in books and technical reports.

### **Dr. Henry Lawson**VICE RECTOR - GHANA COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS



Dr. Henry Lawson is a pioneer consultant in Family Medicine in Ghana who has had extensive experience in medical education at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels. He is currently the Vice rector of the Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons. He is a member of several boards under Food & Drugs Authority, Ghana; Medical and Dental Council, Ghana; Ghana Tertiary Ed-

ucation Commission.

He is a Fellow, Examiner and Executive Office Holder in the Faculty of Family Medicine of Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons and the West African College of Physicians. He was also the first chair of the Local Planning Committee of the Medical Knowledge Fiesta.

He is the Head of the Family Medicine Unit of the University of Ghana Medical School where he coordinates a programme where Family Medicine is taught at the undergraduate level. Henry has supervised research projects for medical and MPH students, and fellowship candidates in Family Medicine. He has been the lead consultant/trainer for Ghana in teaching research and teaching methods with the West African College of physicians under the Doctors as Educators course for the Royal College of Physicians of London. His research interests are non-communicable disease management in primary care and medical education. He has published several papers in reputable journals of medicine.
